

Wood & Treatments

We use only certified wood from high quality suppliers. Our craftsmen choose carefully the wood for each piece of furniture. Selected wood sorts for each piece of furniture can be seen under product pages. Please note that all the models are not available in all species.



Natural Oak

North European Oak is mostly straight grained with a medium to coarse texture. It is widely used in Scandinavian furniture because of its strength.



Black Painted Oak

Paint with a semi matt finish. The grains of the oak is still visible. The top coat gives a hard protection and seals the wood.



Fumed Oak

We "home fume" every piece of furniture in our work shop. Every log has different reaction to the fuming so the color varies across each furniture.



Natural Beech

The grain of the natural beech is straight, with a fine to medium uniform texture. It is strong and durable with a good resistance to abrasion.



Oak White Oiled

Light pigments give the grains a brighter tint. It is waterrepellent, dirt-resistant and durable.



Oiled Beech

Oil is developed from natural oils and waxes to provide the most durable protection. It brings out the warmth and depth of the wood.

Red Lacquered Oak

The colour and a polyurethane top coat is applied to give a semi matt finish. Lacquered oak is durable and resistant against water, moist and heat.



Black Lacquered Oak

The colour and a polyurethane top coat is applied to give a semi matt finish. Lacquered oak is durable and resistant against water, moist and heat.



Oiled Walnut

We use an American walnut because of its luxurious dark brown colour and its grain is revealed by a wax oil treatment.



Green Lacquered Oak

The colour and a polyurethane top coat is applied to give a semi matt finish. Lacquered oak is durable and resistant against water, moist and heat.



Oiled Cherry

American cherry is a supreme hardwood species from the U.S. hardwood forests and is unique to North America, with warm colour tones and superb finishing qualities.



White Olied Maple

Growing naturally in the hardwood forests of North America, Maple is one of the most prolific and sustainable species with creamy to pale reddish brown and grained with a fine texture.
